




During the five year period ending in 2009 there was a 9.1% drop in the number of youth, age 18 - 24 years, who had ever tried alcohol.1

Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) is a term used to describe a range of problems affecting babies whose mothers drank alcohol during pregnancy. Effects may include developmental disorders, physical deformity, trouble remembering, reasoning and learning.²
